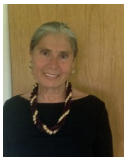
Interfaith Responses to: Racism, Fear, and Injustice

Katlin ministered for several years in Arizona and briefly in Birmingham, Alabama – two regions where racism and injustice are part of the history and current society. Katlin has a heart for the interfaith response in believing that since God created us in diversity, diversity itself is a rich gift for humanity, and even a vessel for restoration.



Rev. Linda Petrucelli, has worn a variety of hats during her career as a United Church of Christ clergywoman, pastoring to local churches in Honomu Hawaii, Iowa, Illinois and Indiana, working in Taiwan as a missionary serving exploited fishing industry fishworkers, and coordinated disaster relief and global development programs at UCC denominational headquarters in New York.



Dr. David Kekaulike Sing, managing partner of Education Prism, LLC, UHH Emeritus Professor. Dr. Sing's research and experience is in creating optimal learning conditions for Native Hawaiians and other underserved populations. He is the recipient of the National Indian Education Association Educator of the Year Award and the Native Hawaiian Education Award.



Dr. George Tanabe, UH Professor Emeritus, President BDK Hawaii and Chairman of BDK America. He is a specialist on the religions of Japan, especially Buddhism, and his books have been published by university presses at Columbia, Harvard, Princeton, and UH. Recipient of the Foreign Minister's Award from the Japanese government, and honored with the Imperial Order of the Rising Sun.
